#### FROM THE PRINCIPAL:

Over the last four weeks, the school has been busy with many families and parents visiting and engaging in One Plan Meetings with teaching staff. It has been a pleasure to have families within the school and be able to sit in many of these meetings and connect, oversee the planning and engagement with individual student goals, and talk about the learning and development of students. If you have not yet had contact with your child's teacher regarding One Plan Meetings, please do so, it is a wonderful opportunity for you to be involved in setting goals, ask questions, and see your child's classroom and learning environment.

Over the holidays a number of projects were undertaken around the school including the installation of high contrast felt walls in our internal withdrawal spaces, new cabinetry in the junior classrooms and the primary playground was prepared for the installation of a climbing frame. Next week the climbing frame is scheduled to be installed (which the students are very excited about), with the hope that it will be officially open from the beginning of Week 6. We have received notification that we have been awarded a Federal Government grant of \$25,000 to upgrade our Playway and install a new sandpit in the back playground. We are currently planning out this space with work to be completed by the end of this year.

We have 12x new Communication iPads across the school including Proloquo. These support our commitment to increase student accessibility and use of a range of communication systems across the school. The number ensures that all teachers and key SSO staff have a device and therefore students are able to access with support at all learning and break times throughout the school day.

Sports Day is scheduled for Friday 2nd June, and we are looking forward to inviting families on site to enjoy this event for the first time in a number of years. Please ensure that you return your order forms if you would like lunch on the day. We are excited to see you all next Friday.



#### 4pm RSL ANZAC Eve Youth Vigil

Following a graffiti attack on the SA State War Memorial on Anzac Eve 1999 the RSL invited youth organisations in South Australia to "Hold Ground" on the North Terrace site for the twelve hours preceding the 6am Anzac Day dawn service. Youth community groups are invited to be involved in honouring those who sacrificed so much by serving their country in times of conflict. Girl Guides, Scouts, Army, Navy and Airforce cadets, CFS, SES, Girls brigade, Boys Brigade, Surf life saving and St Johns members are involved.

6am ANZAC Day Dawn service at the State War Memorial Assemble with 10000 people for service at 5.30am. Watch and listen to the ANZAC ODE, Australian and New Zealand National Anthem, listen to the Last post and revile, stay silent for two minutes.

#### 8am ANZAC Day March

Assemble to be placed in the march line, learn how to carry the banner and support the diggers while marching. The march started at 9.30am, we marched from the SA Museum in North Terrace to St Peters church on King William Street.

11.30am ANZAC Remembrance Service at the Cross of Sacrifice

After the march we took part in the service in the Memorial Garden opposite St Peters cathedral.


